

## How to Celebrate the High Holy Days, Virtually

We are working to make this year's High Holy Days Services and Programming as easy as possible to access. Below you'll find information on our new High Holy Days website page about accessing the different services. We suggest you explore the website now and even though the services won't be streamed yet, the videos may not be up, you will still get a sense of how to navigate each page.

For Fairmount Temple's Virtual High Holy Days, visit:

The worship services and Stern/Samuels Social Action Lecture can be streamed to your computer, iPad, smart phone or TV (via Roku). You can also Zoom many services as well as the new Torah Study sessions.

- To access services/programs, click on [www.fairmounttemple.org/hhd](http://www.fairmounttemple.org/hhd) (all details uploaded by Sept. 14)
- Find the service/program you wish to attend/watch and click on the corresponding link. For example, if you wish to stream a 7:30 pm Congregational Service, find that link and click on it.
- Once you are on the service-specific page, you will find the live-stream link, Zoom access information, and Roku channel.
  - \* To live-stream, click on the streaming link at the time of the service, no log-in is needed. If you access the streaming site earlier than the start time, you will need to refresh your browser at the start time. Using the 7:30 pm Service as an example, if you go to the site at 7:20 pm, the box will show a temple logo. At 7:30 pm, the streamed service will appear live, but you may need to refresh your browser at 7:30 pm, and maybe a few times after that to allow for streaming delays.
  - \* To Zoom into a service, click on the log-in link also available on the page. The log-in password for all Zoom High Holy Day Services and can be found in the High Holy Day Packet mailed to member homes. - If you have Roku on-demand streaming, you can download the Fairmount Temple channels and watch services on your TV. To download, search Roku channels for "Fairmount Sanctuary" and "Fairmount Chapel". Most services and the Stern/Samuels Social Action Lecture will be streamed to the "Sanctuary" channel. Only the 6 pm ACTY Services, the Contemporary Services and the 9 am Simchat RH and YK services will be streamed to the Chapel Channel. (for help, visit [www.roku.com/how-it-works](http://www.roku.com/how-it-works)) *The TV channels are only available through Roku streaming.*
