# What Have We Accomplished To Date?

Criminal Justice - GCC's efforts led to the creation of a much-needed mental health and addiction crisis diversion center in Cuyahoga County, focusing on treatment rather than county jail for those with mental health and substance use disorders. Currently, GCC is working to reduce youth bindovers to adult jail and to address pre-trial justice for adults.

**Gun Safety** - GCC has played a leadership role in the National Gun Safety Consortium, which includes the City of Cleveland. Comprised of 19 municipalities throughout the country, the Consortium is working with the largest health care company in New York State on a study of gun owners' reactions to gun safety products, the results of which has the potential to save lives with reductions in the number of accidents, suicides, and gun theft.

Health Equity - GCC's Dollars for Doses Campaign offered financial incentives to individuals receiving COVID-19 vaccinations in member houses of worship located in underserved communities. This Campaign made it possible for 3754 adults and children to gain access to lifesaving vaccines and mitigate the health risks of the virus.

**Economic Democracy** - This initiative addresses concerns regarding economic imbalances. GCC's PowerUp Purchasing Cooperative has enabled GCC congregations to band together and sign numerous electric and gas supply contracts, generating savings for our member institutions of nearly \$100,000.

**Voter Engagement** - In the fall of 2022, neighborhood captains contacted 1,384 low-propensity voters and mailed voter guides to 6,100 residents. This effort resulted in greater inclusion and fairer representation among voters than in the Fall 2020 election
